VIII. AUDIENCE PARTICIPATION

Gillian Reams, Communications Coordinator, Southeast Michigan Energy Office, announced that the City of Ypsilanti is the first city to reach 200 homes that have had a home energy audit with Better Buildings for Michigan. 55 residents went beyond the audit and used the program's incentives to make improvements to their homes.

The program has helped residents save an average of \$275 per home, per year and reduced the city's carbon footprint by 250 MT CO₂e per year (equivalent to 580 barrels of oil and 1.4% of the city's Climate Action Plan goal)

As promised, she shared 200 cookies with Council and city hall staff. Ms. Reams appreciated and thanked the city for their help and participation in this project. She added that the program still has some funding available and residents can still sign up and use the incentives through March of this year. Information is available at www.mihomeenergy.org.

2. Resolution No. 2013-002, approving the new MERS division for new Non-Union employee hires effective January 1, 2013.

The City Council of the City of Ypsilanti whose fiscal year is July 1 to June 30 desires to make available to its eligible employees benefits provided by the Municipal Employees' Retirement System of Michigan (MERS), as authorized by 1996 PA 220. Benefits available are those provided under the Plan Document of 1996.

IT IS RESOLVED that pursuant to the Initial Actuarial Valuation dated December 10, 2012 by MERS' actuary, MERS benefits stated in Section

1 below are to be provided to the following employee division (e.g., general, police and fire, DPW, union, non-union): non-union new hires effective 1/1/2013.

Please note: If no Initial Valuation has been done by MERS' actuary on the specific benefit program (or combination of programs) selected below; or the Initial Valuation is more than one (1) year old at the time MERS' coverage becomes effective as provided under Section 4 of this Resolution; then, per Retirement Board requirements, this Resolution will not be implemented until a current actuarial valuation is done by MERS' actuary and necessary supporting contribution rates certified.

The City of Ypsilanti has reviewed the benefits offered to its employees and determined to adjust the retirement benefits for Non-Union employees hired on or after January 1, 2013. Implementation of this change requires a separate MERS division to be set up and an average work day to be defined.

Non-Union employees hired prior to January 1, 2013 would remain on the old plan which has a multiplier of 2.5% and allows retirement at age 50 with 25 years of service. Employees hired after January 1, 2013 will have a multiplier of 2% and would allow retirement at age 55 with 25 years of service.

Council Member Murdock asked how many groups the city has now.

Ms. Tisch answered six including this one.

Mr. Murdock asked if there were any other changes to retiree benefits.

Ms. Tisch answered yes and said City Council has seen them.

Mr. Murdock asked if changes have been made for new hires yet.

City Manager Lange replied yes and said they are still evolving.

Council Member Robb pointed out that the Employee Non-Union handbook doesn't match what the benefits actually are.

Ms. Tisch said the handbook will be updated soon by Human Resources.

Mr. Murdock asked when City Council will approve the benefit changes.

Mr. Lange inquired if every change to the non-union handbook needs formal approval by Council.

Council Member Moeller asked if City Council will vote on benefits.

Ms. Tisch stated the purpose of the resolution is to approve the MERS program. She said no major changes have been made and she doesn't recall ever coming to Council in the past for other benefit changes.

Council Member Moeller commented the benefits of union members are taken care of in their contract.

Mr. Lange answered yes and said he is attempting to keep overhead costs down with new hires for both and that is why he is trying to create a two-tier system.

Ms. Tisch said she will bring a resolution approving the changes to the non-union contract at the next meeting.

Each month of such work hours equals one month of credited service).

Accounting Supervisor Sallea Tisch was present to answer questions from Council.

Council Member Robb pointed out that the SEMCOG audit says a change in work hours is needed and asked if that item was scratched from the list of proposed changes they suggested.

Ms. Tisch explained that the hours will still come out to 80 hours bi-weekly, however MERS needs this for computation purposes only.

Mr. Robb asked if the MERS attorney was consulted.

Ms. Tisch answered no. She said they count hours worked and the intent is to change the multiplier not the number of hours worked.

5. Resolution No. 2013-005, approving transfer of \$133,528 in assets from the existing MERS plan to the new plan for AFSCME employees.

Resolution Requesting Reallocation of Assets

Whereas, the City of Ypsilanti has been a participating municipality in the Municipal Employees' Retirement System of Michigan ('MERS"); and

Whereas, pursuant to Municipal Employees' Retirement Board requirements, since December 31, 1994, asset accounting had been separate for each division, instead of aggregate for the entire municipality; and

Whereas, over time, significant disparities have arisen in the City's MERS plan as a result of allocating the fair market value of plan assets on a divisional basis instead of on an aggregate basis, which disparities the City of Ypsilanti wishes to eliminate; and

Whereas, in order to address the anticipated increase in unfunded liability for pensions to be provided participants in the defined benefit plan that is likely to occur as a result of diminished contributions to that plan, the city wishes to reallocate certain divisional market assets between the two divisions;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the governing body of City of Ypsilanti, a participating municipality as defined in the Municipal Employees' Retirement Act as recodified by Act No. 427 of the Public Acts of 1984, as amended, and as the employer, hereby requests MERS to reallocate the total market value of assets of \$133,528 of Employer Assets from Division 0 General AFSCME Employer Reserve to Division 16 Employer Reserve as of December 1, 2012 enabling the actuary to prepare the 2012 actuarial valuation with the transferred assets.

City Manager Lange gave an overview of the request. He said staff noticed there were two persons who should have been moved from a 2.5% multiplier to a 2.0% and they are correcting it. He said this will not hurt the city but is merely putting a little more in the plan.

Council Member Robb asked how much is in the fund now.

Mr. Lange replied \$0.00 and said this resolution is creating the fund.

Council Member Murdock asked if the new account will have three people.

Mr. Lange replied yes.

Council Member Murdock asked what the contribution is.

Mr. Lange replied the contribution is not near \$133,528.

Council Member Murdock added it was only a two year window so there shouldn't be a lot of contribution.

Mr. Lange said we are making the transfer so that when the actuarial analysis is conducted, the money will not have to come from the general fund.

Mr. Robb said he would like to see the figures from past years in order to see where we've gone and how we've sank.

Mr. Lange said the city is trying to stay ahead of the curve and manage funds correctly. He said the city has managed funds well and this will be a benefit in the end.

Council Member Robb moved to amend the amount from \$133,528 to \$29,322.

The motion died for lack of support.

XIII. COUNCIL PROPOSED BUSINESS

MURDOCK

- Requested a public hearing be added for the Food Processing ordinance when it comes back to Council.
- Commented there needs to be changes in the procedure and ordinance for snow removal and obnoxious weeds in order to compress the time schedule.
- Said he plans to bring a resolution to Council in support of the City of Ann Arbor's position on regional transportation.

ROBB

- Inquired about a second goal setting session to address economic development and ordinance enforcement. He said Council needs a presentation in order to give direction to Ordinance Enforcement so they are clear about what City Council feels is important.
- Reported he spoke with Ms. Gillotti and Mr. Daniels regarding changing the ordinance to allow 24 hours for removal of snow and if not then the city will abate. He said he would like to set guidelines and notice residents so that the new procedure is in place for next year. He said he would distribute possible changes to Council and staff for review.

Mr. Robb said if it comes in February it will not make it to the goals.

XV. COMMUNICATIONS FROM THE CITY MANAGER

- Announced the city received some good press on the Better Buildings program.
- Said it is possible that the City will seek fire help from the Township. He said Interim Chief Anthoroud received positive feedback from the Township.

- Announced he has scheduled two dates for police union contract negotiations
- Asked if City Council needs to see and approve every single word or change in union contracts.

Council Member Robb answered no and said just the major changes.

- Informed Council that another letter regarding dog licenses will be send out because the first one was misleading.
- Draft of Goal Setting priorities coming soon.
- Economic Development/Water Street work session coming in February
- HR Manager Judi Smith will participate as a panelist for the YHC Executive Director interviews.
- Announced that the Grove Road project is moving along. Said he is trying to secure easements and the first meeting of the Joint Committee, Kent Early and Supervisor Stumbo will occur soon.
- Announced retirement party for Jon Ichesco on January 20th at Fire Museum
- Street lighting assessment is coming along. Work with Mr. Barr on it.

Mayor Pro-Tem Richardson asked if the Deputy Chief position has been filled.

Mr. Lange replied no and said there are some tricky items being worked out. He said he is trying to get a retired sworn officer. He said the city is down to three people and he is working on contract language.

- Commented that furlough days are causing problems and he is thinking that new employees will be exempt from them which would not subject them to the %5 cut.

Mayor Pro-Tem Richardson asked if the salary will reflect a 5% reduction.

Mr. Lange replied no, the salary will be whatever is negotiated.
